



## **Policy and Procedures for Key Worker/Vulnerable Children Provision and for Wider re-opening (individual class bubbles)**

**We are relying on parents to follow current guidance from the government on social-distancing, to ensure that children are not mixing in a way which would pose addition risk of the spreading of the virus. Parents are advised to keep up to date with these guidelines if you are sending or planning to send your child to school.**

For the duration of this provision, we at Beulah Junior School will observe social distancing as far as possible in order to minimise the risk of spreading the virus.

Temperatures will be taken when pupils arrive. Pupils displaying a high temperature (as indicated by our equipment) will be asked to remain at home.

Key worker/vulnerable pupil provision will be run in the hall as a separate 'bubble' and will be staffed accordingly.

Extended opening for one class on every Monday, Wednesday and Friday will take place in three upstairs classrooms (up to 10 chn per class).

Children will be seated at least the required distance (two metres) from each other. Areas will be regularly sanitised.

As far as possible, children will be given their own set of equipment to use during the day.

Adults working with children will be offered protective masks and gloves (gloves will be suggested for certain tasks but not for continued use during the day). Children may wear their own masks if parents wish but this will not be enforced and children will not be provided with masks by the school.

Handwashing facilities will be available for pupils throughout the day, and they will be expected to wash their hands on entry to the school and at regular intervals throughout the day, following the 20 second guidance.

Handsanitisers, sanitising spray, antibacterial wipes and tissues will be provided.

Areas in use will be sanitised throughout the day (especially after lunch or physical activity).

Classes will be cleaned after each use. Thorough cleans will be done between each 'class bubble' on days where no new class bubble is in school.

If a child experiences any symptoms associated with the virus, they must inform an adult immediately. If this occurs, or if they are seen to be unwell, they will be immediately isolated, their temperature taken and parents will be contacted. We will advise parents to isolate and seek a test.
