

Task 1:

After reading pages 10-11 you would have noticed that Rosa is not happy with how she and others are being treated. Her life was full of rules that she knew were not right. How would you feel if your life were full of rules that worked against you, solely based on the colour of your skin? Discuss with someone at home.



Make a mind map of advice you would give Rosa Parks.

Now write a short paragraph about the changes you would make if your life were full of rules. Try to use commas in a list, and a range of different sentence openers in your paragraph.

Task 2:



Looking at this image, I would like you to write what you see, think and wonder.

Now look at the image above and write a caption for it.

(A caption is a sentence or group of words that is written on or next to a picture to explain what is being shown.)



Example: Young woman told to get off the bus !

Read 12- 15.

On page 15 Rosa was taken to prison because she did not give her seat up on the bus. Do you think this was fair/unfair? Discuss with someone at home.



Create a poster to persuade the government to allow Rosa to be released from prison. Try to use emotive language in your poster!

Task 3

Your task is to write a letter and imagine you were living in the same time period as Rosa Parks. Write a letter to the government to persuade them to treat all people equally.

Discuss with someone at home what you are going to include in your letter.

Use the plan below to help you write your letter:

1. Discuss why this issue is important e.g. people felt isolated and unhappy as they had to use separate schools, shops and toilets because of their skin colour.
2. What has happened due to this – Rosa Parks refused to give up her seat, which led to many people protesting.
3. What changes would you like to see? E.g. everyone to use buses, toilets and shops freely etc.

Remember to:

- Include the features of a letter (Dear, I am writing to..., Yours Sincerely etc)
- Use conjunctions to explain your thoughts and feelings in detail
- Vary your sentence openers
- Include ambitious vocabulary in your writing
- Think carefully about punctuation
- Check and edit your writing when you
